Bentiu PoC Snapshot

Rubkona County, Unity State, South Sudan

Summary

Bentiu protection of civilians site (PoC) was established in December 2013 following the outbreak of violence. The majority of the internal displaced persons (IDP) are from Unity State in particular Guit County and Rubkona County.

Demographic data was provided by IOM (as of 13/07/2015), site population provided by camp manager (biometric registration as of 24/04/2015 and temporary registration as of 27/07/2015), spatial data was provided by IOM and REACH (as of 27/07/2014), all other data provided by camp manager (as of 29/06/2015).



Key Developments

The population in Bentiu PoC continues to increase, with an estimated 30,000 new arrivals in the last two months, the majority from Rubkona, Guit and Koch Counties. The CCCM cluster estimates that there could be up to 117,000 people inside the POC by the end of the year. A new arrival registration center and transit area have been created to accommodate continued influx and enhance capacity to register and provide transit for new arrivals. All sectors are working to scale up activities to respond to the increase in population. Water provision continues to be a challenge. A new borehole is currently being drilled to increase yield.

Relocation of the population to the new extension is ongoing and is set to be completed by the end of July 2015. As of 17 July, 8,000 HH made up of 50,000 individuals have been relocated. The extension is not large enough to accommodate the entire population so CCCM partners are continuing large-scale earthworks and drainage projects to develop areas of the old PoC for eventual use for shelter and services.


