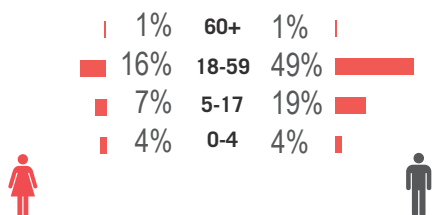

This biweekly factsheet presents the main findings and primary areas of concern based on data collected in 16-31 May 2016 in Serbia and FRYOM. Data is based on a total of 136 groups interviewed representing a total of 621 individuals.

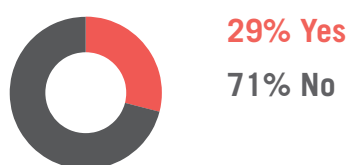
