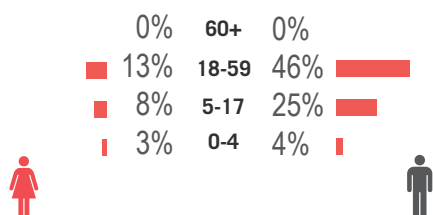


REACH, with the support of ECHO, is conducting regular assessments in order to inform on the EU migration crisis in the Western Balkans. This biweekly factsheet presents the main findings and primary areas of concern based on data collected in 1-18 April 2016 in Serbia and FRYOM. Data is based on a total of 100 groups interviewed representing a total of 401 individuals.

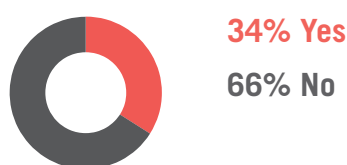
