This factsheet provides an overview of key findings from the WASH baseline assessment.

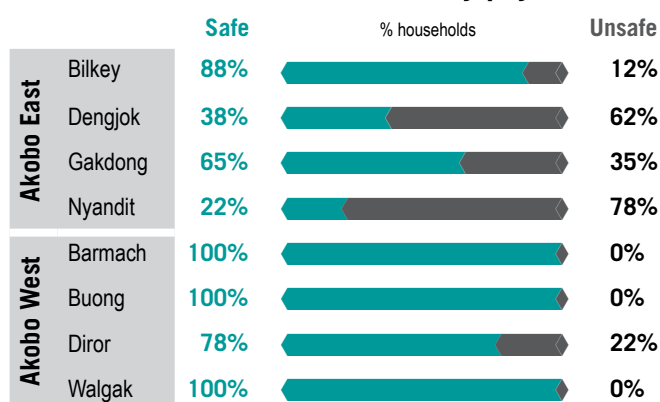
Findings are based on data collected from 624 households, between January and February 2016, and can be generalised to the entire county population with 90% confidence and 5% margin of error.



Access to safe drinking water

Overall, nearly **78%** of households across Akobo County have access to a safe source of drinking water.
